#1. Let Given the alphabet $\Sigma = \{a,b\}$, and the languages over Σ : $L_1 = \{aaa\}^*$,
 $L_2 = \{a,b\} \{a,b\} \{a,b\} \{a,b\}$ and $L_3 = L_2^*$, describe the strings in

- a) L_2
- b) L_3
- c) $L_1 \cap L_3$

#2. Give regular expressions for the following:

- a) The set of strings over $\{a,b,c\}$ where all the a's precede all the b's which precede all the c's (there may be no a's, b's or c's)
- b) The set of strings over $\{0,1\}$ which contain the substring 00 and the substring 11 .
- c) The set of strings over $\{a,b\}$ which do not contain the substring ab .

#3. Let G be the grammar:

$S \rightarrow 0 \mid 1 \mid 0S0 \mid 1S1 \mid \lambda \mid 00 \mid 11$

- a) Show a leftmost derivation of 011110
- b) Create a parse tree for 011110
- c) Show that this grammar is ambiguous
- d) Describe $L(G)$ using set notation
